Ramius' Life Story

Ramius Edward McPhatter, Sr., affectionately known as “Bucky, Eddie, Mac, or Coach,” was born on October 22, 1949 to the late Ramius McPhatter and Ruby Lee Elliott in Fayetteville, NC. He peacefully transitioned on Wednesday, August 21, 2024, surrounded by family and friend with love and laughter, just as he lived his life.

Ramius attended school in the Fayetteville’s Cumberland County Public School System, graduating from E.E. Smith High School. After completing Job Corp in Kentucky, he relocated to Washington, DC and enrolled in Cortez Petters Business School. Always eager to learn, in 1997, Ramius earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Human Services from George Washington University.

Ramius met his wife, Lynn, the day she arrived in Washington, DC; they have been together ever since united in holy matrimony for 53 years. They were the proud parents of two sons, Ramius McPhatter, Jr. and Jared Keith McPhatter. Ramius, Sr. often stated that Ramius, Jr. was the best thing he had done in his life and he and grandson, Tevon, were his world.

His love of children transitioned his career from Job Corp, Potomac & Woodland to the halls of Prince Georges’ County Public Schools as a teacher, youth advocate, and coach. Prior to that he worked at C&P Telephone Company and George Washington University.

Over 30 years ago, Ramius joined The New Macedonia Baptist Church under the leadership of the late Reverend Dr. Robert L. Walls, Sr. and continued his faithful service under the current Senior Pastor, Reverend Patrick J. Walker. His love for children extended to the church as he was a part of the Youth Ministry, Lott Carey Youth Convention, boys basketball and Overcomers ministries.

Ramius was a member and contributor of many organizations, too many to name but most recently, “Friends of Anacostia Park.” He was also a member of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Incorporated.

Ramius was a man of many talents: swimming instructor at Prince Georges’ Community College, as well as other local pools, an avid horticulturist, and coaching, which was his pride and joy. His last coaching assignments were with Bladensburg High School and Maya Angelou French Immersion School girls’ softball teams. He loved coaching and mentoring his girls.

Ramius was preceded in death by his son, Jared Keith McPhatter.
